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At its most simple, coaching is an extremely old and very well-practiced²⁴ way of operating under someone's guidance²⁵ to grow, change or develop in some way, perhaps to be better at your job, or maybe to get more satisfaction out of your career. Coaching is often understood as anything that happens in and is related to²⁶ a relationship²⁷ between someone more experienced and someone less experienced, a relationship that exists specifically in order to transfer skill²⁸, knowledge²⁹, improve³⁰ performance³¹, define goals³² and remove any obstacles³³ on the way to achieving³⁴ these goals... In this respect, it differs³⁵ only superficially³⁶ from the age-old³⁷ bonds³⁸ between a master³⁹ and an apprentice⁴⁰, a tutor⁴¹ and a pupil and many others. It may even appear⁴², that, like the Eskimos and snow, we have a lot of words relating to the many varieties⁴³ of the concept, rather than a single word that describes the phenomenon⁴⁴ itself. That's why smart corporate gurus invented⁴⁵ such an all-encompassing⁴⁶, but very vague⁴⁷ term to gather some loosely⁴⁸ fitting⁴⁹ ideas in one place. Of course, any self-respecting⁵⁰ guru would immediately try to coach you on the proper⁵¹ understanding of coaching. They'd do so according to⁵² the typical practice of coaching: They'd ask you some simple questions that are supposed to get the proverbial⁵³ juices flowing⁵⁴, then by answering those, make you realise⁵⁵ some truths about coaching. Afterwards, they'd help you realise what is it that you're trying to reach – here it's the
