

# THE BEACH IN MECHELINKI

AS A BASECAMP  
INTO THE BAY

**Mechelinki (Kash. Mechelinka or Mechelinga, Mechelinczi) has been the site of one of the largest beach fishing harbors on the Kashubian coast since at least the 13th century. A beautiful viewpoint overlooking the Puck Bay here is the Cliff of Mechelinki. Also attracting attention are the historic 250-year-old ash trees named Mściwój and Świętopętk. In the immediate vicinity of Mechelinki is the "Mechelińskie Łąki" nature reserve.**



Since 2014, a modern reinforced concrete fishing harbor has been available here. Mooring piers for fishing vessels are located at the end of a long, wooden pier, on which it is pleasant to walk.

On the other hand, spacious buildings have been built by the beach, where fishermen have their warehouses. There they also prepare the fish they catch for sale.

Delicious fish dishes are served in local restaurants. There is also a smokehouse in the village.

For those fishing from the shore and those who like to wade, a leopard bottom, home to sea trout and garfish, awaits.

At the marina you can launch your boat and fish further from shore.

Mechelinki is a good basecamp, both for those wishing to fish in the vicinity of Osłonino or Rzucewo, as well as for those who, in search of a sea fishing adventure,

The Mechelinki Cliff is one of the most picturesque places in Northern Kashubia, stretching from Mechelinki southwards towards Gdynia.

want to try their luck in the areas of Oksywie or Gdynia, especially around the cliff in Orłowo. This is one of the country's best-known fishing grounds for sea trout and garfish, caught both from the shore and from a boat, and in the summer – asps, which are hunted here with a fly rod or spinning rod in hand.

I leave the rest to your imagination. It can drive you to explore and energize you to spend your time actively. So I encourage you to discover the charms of Northern Kashubia, reach for information about the history, culture of the region and have fun "with a pole" in your hand.



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
